



CAMP KUZUMA, CHOBE – FACT SHEET

LOCATION:

Camp Kuzuma is an exclusive and private boutique tented camp located in the pristine Kazuma Forest Reserve in the Chobe region of Botswana. The lodge is located 85 km from Kasane and is approximately an hour's drive from Kasane Airport.

GPS CO-ORDINATES:

Camp Kuzuma, Chobe - S18 34.03 E25 48.68

CLIMATE:

Summer months (November to March) tend to be quite hot and has the highest rainfall of the year.

Cooler months (April to October) tend to be cool to warm days, with evening and night temperatures being rather chilly.

ACCOMMODATION:

Camp Kuzuma has 7 luxury open-plan tented suites situated under a canopy of Mopane trees, designed to look out into the bushveld while providing absolute privacy.

Our 7 tented suites offer luxury and comfort in this magnificent wilderness area. Each suite exudes a romantic and nostalgic ambience with safari memorabilia throughout. All suites are luxurious spaces each with a private sun deck and ensuite canvas bathrooms with high-back Victorian baths, double basins, double inside showers and an outside shower.

CHILD POLICY:

- * Children aged 7 – 17 years (Maximum 2 children) stay free of charge when sharing with 2 adults
- * Children occupying their own chalet:
 - children aged 7 – 12 pay 50% of the adult rate and children aged 13 to 17 pay 75% of the adult rate
- * Children staying free of charge will be charged for the complimentary Chobe boat cruise

THE MAIN CAMP:

The main lodge area is home to an open-plan bar, lounge and dining area. The main area extends onto a large wooden deck with a swimming pool that overlooks a floodlit waterhole that is frequently visited by an abundance of wildlife including elephant and lion. WIFI is available in the main area.

The nearby sunken firepit just off the deck is a welcoming space for guests looking to find solitude and comfort whilst reading a book in the cool afternoon breeze, it is also the location to enjoy a unique Boma dining experience under the African sky.

SOLAR POWER AND USE OF ENERGY:

Our aim at Camp Kuzuma is to touch the earth lightly and minimize our carbon footprint. We operate completely off the grid using 100% renewable solar energy systems, with power being generated by solar panels.

We do offer air-conditioning but only turn it on at certain times in order to preserve power.

ECO-FRIENDLY POOL:

Our pool is a natural Ozone pool.

FOOD:

We utilise the surrounding villages to supply fresh produce to the lodge where possible. This will facilitate empowering the local farmers and support the villages in a continuous and sustainable way. We also have our own aquaponics veggie and herb garden.

GUEST AMENITIES:

All guest amenities including shampoo, conditioner, foam bath, liquid gel and soaps are sourced from the Charlotte Rhys biodegradable product range.

WATER SUPPLY:

Water is supplied from our underground borehole. We operate on an Eco Green Sewage system which allows us to recycle white, grey and black water to such an extent that it turns into green effluent water, used to feed the waterhole in front of the main area as well as the protected trees in the camp inside the electric fence.

ACTIVITIES:**Half-day Game Drives:**

Explore our 11,000 hectare private concession on an open Land Rover. Game drives take place in the early morning and late afternoon to take advantage of cooler weather and optimal animal activity, evening game drives allow guests to experience the bush at night and discover nocturnal animals. An expert guide and a tracker ensure your wildlife experience will be something to remember.

Game Walks:

Allowing guests to get more intimately acquainted with the finer details of the bush. We have some amazing trails around the camp where expert guides can introduce our guests to the Small Five: The elephant shrew, leopard tortoise, rhinoceros beetle, ant lion and buffalo weaver!

Bird Watching:

The Kazuma Plains are renowned for their prolific birdlife, making Camp Kuzuma perfect for twitchers. For enthusiasts, some 380 different African bird species are found in this region.

ACTIVITIES OFFERED AT AN ADDITIONAL CHARGE:

Hot Air Balloon Trip:

This sensationally slow form of experiential travel fulfills many people's dreams of a romantic safari holiday. Glide peacefully through the air, suspended in a basket above the bush. Observe the movement of the herds below and receive a bird's eye view of grassy plains and Ilala Palms. Please note Hot Air Balloon Trips are operational from 01st May until the 15th September 2020.

Fishing Expeditions:

The Chobe River is a popular and unique spot for fishing. Camp Kuzuma offers a unique fishing experience which includes transfers, all fishing tackle, soft drinks, snacks, lunch on full days, coffee, tea and a selection of alcoholic beverages.

Spa Treatment:

Enjoy a soothing spa treatment in the wild. We offer reflexology and aromatherapy massages in our open air spa tent.

VEHICLES:

There are 2 Game Vehicles permanently stationed at the lodge. 2 x 9-seaters.

Activities:	
1. How long are the half-day game drives?	Half-day game drive : +- 3 hours
2. Is drinks/snacks provided on the game drives?	Drinks and snacks are provided on game drives.
3. Are children allowed on game activities? What is the age limit?	Yes, from 11 years for game drives & 17 years on game walks.
4. Is there a fence around the concession?	No, there is no fence.
5. Can I go for a walk on the concession without a guide?	No, guests are to be escorted by a guide. Guests can freely move around the lodge during the day.
6. What kind of animals can I expect to see?	Elephants, Leopard, Lion, Warthog, variety of birds, Buffalo, Painted Dog, Cheetah, Jackal, Giraffe, Hares, Hyena, Mongoose, Civet, Genets, Honey Badger, Monkey, Bat-eared fox, Zebra, Pangolin, variety of antelope etc.

Facilities - Suites	
1. How many suites are there?	7 Luxury tented suites.
2. Do suites have electricity?	Yes
3. What view do the suites have?	Suites face the bushveld
4. How many people can fit in 1 suite?	Triple (2 Adults + 1 Child - Double + Single)
5. Are there Family suites for children?	No family Suite. We have 2 tented suites next to each other with interleading walk way. The distance between each entrance is +- 4 metres.
6. Which suite is closest to the Main Area? Recommended for old people?	Suites 1 - 3 is the closest. Suites 6 and 7 are the furthest.
7. Is there internet in the suites?	No. Only in the Main Area.
8. What are the suite facilities?	King size bed, mosquito net, en suite bathroom with bath and outside shower. Inside his and hers shower. Hot water bottle in winter. Fan. Tea & coffee facilities, mosquito repellent, emergency air horn, rechargeable torches, aircons, sherry station, hairdryer
9. Are there safes in each suite?	Yes
10. Is there a fridge in the suite?	No
11. Is there laundry services available?	Yes
12. What time does rooms service clean?	When guests are on game drives.

Facilities – Main Area	
13. Is there a Spa?	Yes, a spa is available.
14. Is the dining area outside or inside?	Outside and inside, Boma dinner. Private dinner can be arranged on the deck or in-room dining.
15. Does the lodge have a pool?	Yes, Natural Ozone Eco Swimming pool.
16. What time is breakfast/lunch/dinner served?	Discussed with guests.
17. Can I have a Boma dinner?	Yes
18. Is there a bar?	Yes

1. Where are the Camp Kuzuma transfers to/from?	We offer transfers to/from Kasane, Vic Falls and Livingstone.
2. Can I Self-Drive?	Yes.
3. What are the directions?	Directions provided on request.
4. When is the best time to visit?	From May to November.



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5. What type of clothing do you recommend I pack?	Neutral coloured clothing, warm jacket in winter.
6. Can we charge phones?	Yes, charging station in main area as well as in each chalet, adapter available.
7. Check-in & Check-out Times	Check in: after 12pm Check out: 11am Earlier check in or late check out can be arranged.
8. Mobility / Accessibility: are we geared for Disabilities (Wheelchairs etc.)	Yes, all suites are accessible. Camp staff know how to assist.
9. Can guest walk to their suites?	Guests are escorted to their rooms at night, by a guide/camp staff.
